## Did you know?

**Ladybugs** beat their wings 85 times a second when they fly – and they won't fly if the temperature is below 55 degrees Fahrenheit. A one-gallon jar will hold from 72,000 to 80,000 ladybugs. In 1975, Ohio selected the ladybug as the official state insect because they are hardy, hard-working, and beautiful.

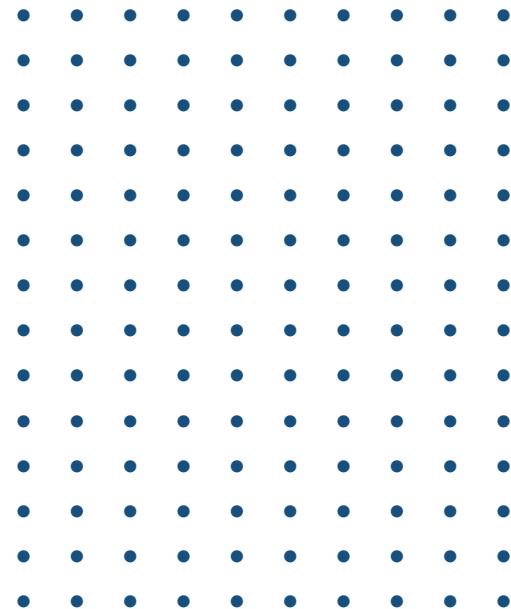


Trees like the **Ohio Buckeye** help maintain clean air and water, enrich the soil, and offer food and shelter to wildlife.

## Did you know?

The **White Trillium** is the state flower of Ohio, and it was used medicinally by Native Americans and early colonists. It grows in shady areas and blooms from April to June in all 88 Ohio counties.

## Did you know?

The **White-tailed deer** runs up to 30 miles per hour, and its tan coat turns a grayish brown in the winter for better camouflage. Their babies have white spots to help keep them hidden from predators. They eat green plants in the summer and nuts, corn, buds and twigs in the fall and winter.
