Northeast Ohio is home to the world's largest Amish settlement with a population of nearly 40,000. In the center of this region is Holmes County with an exceptional concentration of Amish families. Also part of this area are Mennonites. Both groups share a common history and a strong commitment to the Christian faith. To better understand the faith and practice of these unique peoples, visit the attractions included in this tour. All are owned or operated by Amish or Mennonites. In addition to offering interesting and unusual venues, they provide a flavor of, or information about, the Amish and Mennonite way of life.

1 | **Lehman's Hardware and Appliance** *Kidron*

2 | **Yoder's Amish Home** *Near Walnut Creek*

Step back to a simple time and way of life with a tour of Yoder's Amish Home, an authentic 116 acre Amish Farm. Friendly knowledgeable guides will take you on conducted tours through the 2 houses, a barn full of farm animals, and a one-room school. You can view a working kitchen and enjoy leisurely buggy rides. The history and customs of the Amish faith will be explained.

3 | **Behalt. Amish & Mennonite Heritage Center** *Berlin*

The Center also offers a 15-minute video on the local Amish and Mennonite community. Here you will find a book and gift store, maps, and brochures to help you plan your visit in Holmes County.
